

AGD HOUSE OF DELEGATES, 2019

On November 8, 2019,, the AGD HOD meets in Chicago. This is the third year that AGD has chosen to hold the Scientific and the Governance meetings on different dates. When held at the same time, Governance participants could not earn CE, due to required attendance for official AGD business.

Time will tell if this was a good decision or not. Our Governance meeting is being held in a huge convention center outside of the city proper. If you are involved, and are trying to reach the venue from the assigned hotel, you may think you are crossing Rhode Island on foot!

In October, your Region 19 Delegates met in Atlanta to discuss the Resolutions that will come before the HOD in November. In the past, your Region 19 has produced new Resolutions, as does any other AGD Region.

FYI, each Delegate is responsible for voting the way he or she feels about a particular Resolution. This vote may or may not reflect the opinions of the Region represented or the Board of Trustees recommendation.

In my opinion, this year's Resolutions are rather bland. Some concern omitting policies which still exist in old Bylaws, but are no longer pertinent to 21st Century concerns.

There may be two Resolutions offered this year which spark some interaction on the HOD floor. **Resolution 323 concerns allowing dental school students to serve as delegates, with voting privileges.**

I believe students should be allowed to attend the meeting, and every effort should be made to mentor them in AGD's role in serving the General Dentist. However, students are, by definition, heavily involved in their schooling in dentistry. I am not sure they are ready, nor do they have the extra time, to delve into resolution details. For this reason, I feel voting privileges should not be granted. (My opinion, no reflecting of ALAGD.)

Resolution 304 deals with adding Trustees to the list of leaders who must not campaign on behalf of candidates seeking office in AGD. Adding Trustees to the prohibited classes of campaign participants will ensure efficient and accountable infrastructure in AGD's governance.

I would vote "Yes" on this Resolution, as I believe candidates should stand on their own merits and qualifications. However, the national BOT recommends Resolution 304 be defeated.

Tune in for our next "Alabama Composite" issue. I will report on the "exciting" outcome of the AGD Governance Meeting in Chicago.





MASTER TRACK PROGRAM

GREAT NEWS: ALAGD now has a Master Track Program for any members who desire to work toward the MAGD award.

The Program is being led by Dr. Wendy Holder, of Alexander City, AL. Wendy received her MAGD this past year, and is eager to help other dentists with this program.

Protocol for the Master Track courses has three primary components:

1. Classroom session
2. A homework assignment to be completed independently by participants in their practices, with their own patients
3. Presentation, critique, and evaluation of the homework, with the Master Track Instructor

Master Track Instructors are carefully selected, based on peer recommendations and professional experience.

This program consists of a four-year opportunity to earn 600 hours needed, beyond Fellowship, to complete Mastership in the AGD.
