TWO YEARS AND COUNTING...

March marked the two-year anniversary of the COVID-19 pandemic, as worldwide, communities were transformed by the

virus. Businesses across our planet were ordered closed. This included our profession, for dentistry offers high risk of contracting and transmitting this heinous disease, owing to the nature of dental procedures, as well as face-to-face contact with patients.

COVID-19 has greatly affected the practice of dentistry. We practitioners have suffered high levels of stress, and there have been long-term effects on our profession.

We as dentists were ordered to stop all treatment, save emergency procedures, although our overhead expenses were not reduced at all. Rent, Utilities, Payroll, and Supplies continued to demand payment, and—surprise, surprise—emergencies did not pay the bills!

We have all witnessed favorite businesses failing after being closed for months, unable to recover financially. Everywhere we look, even now, desperate signage of "Now Hiring" is displayed in many windows.

Whatley Health Clinic, where I worked for several years part-time, after leaving private practice, had the same problem as every other business: long-term assistants did not want to return to work after the initial shutdown.

We were fortunate that the Alabama Board of Dental Examiners promptly outlined regulations to protect dentists, staff, and patients, when we were finally allowed to practice again. However, new PPE requirements brought added financial anxiety, especially when shortages of these supplies popped up.

Our heartfelt sympathy and concern goes out to those who have suffered with COVID-19. Symptoms have ranged from little or no effects to severe illness, hospitalization, or even death!

There is the terrifying possibility of having to close one's office because of devastating loss of one's health. There are those who, once contracting the disease, seem unable to shake the long-term effects. Awful possibilities are endless.

We can only continue to do our best. We have all been carefully schooled in proper use of PPE to protect our patients & staff, ourselves, and our families. We will do what we have always done: prevent the spread of disease, both dental and otherwise!

Hopefully, scientists are learning more about fighting this. But it is not over, not by a long shot.

Sure masking mandates have been dropped almost everywhere, but keep them handy. New variants will continue to appear. More than 600 cases of the XE Variant have been reported in the UK alone. This is a "recombinant", meaning that is is comprised of genetic material from two other strains! The World Health Organization claims that it is 10% more transmissible than Omicron!

Dental practice will survive. We have dealt with pandemics before, and we will continue to take the precautions necessary to guard against spread of disease in our offices and clinics. Stay safe and keep up with the science.








HISTORIC FATHER-SON ALUMNI AWARDS PRESENTED
